Sugar Plum Punch

1 (25.4 oz.) Bottle Sparkling White Grape Juice 2 Cups Cranberry or Cran-Cherry Juice

2 Tbsp. Fresh Lime Juice

Chill the grape juice and cranberry juice for at least 30 minutes before prepping. Combine all the ingredients in a medium sized pitcher and stir. Pour and serve. Makes 6 wine-sized glasses of punch.

Festive Holiday Punch

- 1 Bottle (64 oz.) Cranberry-Raspberry Juice (chilled)
- 1 Can (12 oz.) Frozen Raspberry Lemonade Concentrate (thawed)
- 1 Bottle (2 liters) Lemon-Lime Soda (chilled) Fresh Raspberries

Ice Cubes

Lime Wedges (optional)

In a punch bowl, mix juice and lemonade concentrate. Stir in the soda; top with raspberries. Serve over ice. If desired, garnish glasses with lime wedges. Makes 14 servings (3/4 cup each).



- 1 Bottle (2 liters) Lemon-Lime Soda
- 1 Bottle (64 oz.) Cranberry Juice Blend
- 1 Cup Sugar
- 1 Can Frozen Lemonade Concentrate (thawed)
- 1 Can Frozen Orange Juice Concentrate (thawed)

Ice Cubes

Water (for amount see directions)

Garnishes: Lemon Slices, Cranberries, Fresh **Rosemary Sprigs**

Combine the soda and the cranberry blend. Add the sugar and stir vigorously until combined and the sugar is dissolved. Add the thawed concentrates, stir again.

If you desire a strong punch you can leave it as is and just add ice. If you wish to dilute it a bit, add up to 3 cups of water (or to your taste). Remember adding ice will further dilute the punch, so be careful. Add the garnishes if desired. If using the lemon do not forget to wash it well. Serves about 16.





Some surprising benefits of blueberries

Small, yet bursting with big flavor, blueberries are a favorite of so many people. While blueberries may be coveted for their appeal in recipes that run the gamut from breakfast foods to desserts, the nutrients within them provide many benefits as well. After all, blueberries are not called "superfoods" for nothing.

Here's a deeper look at some of the health benefits of blueberries.

1. Blueberries are a low-calorie food. Healthline notes that blueberries contain only 84 calories per cup. Plus they are 85 percent water. Blueberries can be a filling snack that doesn't compromise lowcalorie diets.

2. Blueberries may improve exercise recovery rates. Research published in the Iranian Journal of Public Health in 2018 has shown that eating blueberries can increase muscle strength recovery. That means that blueberries may help thwart a condition called exercise-induced muscle damage, which results in soreness, reduced muscle strength and impaired athletic performance.

3. Blueberries help fight urinary tract infections. Cranberries are often touted as the go-to for treating and preventing UTIs. But, according to a 1998 study published in The New England Journal of Medicine, specific compounds found in blueberries known as proanthocyanidins can prevent bacteria from sticking to the walls of the urinary tract. Furthermore, the high amounts of vitamin C in blueberries also can inhibit the growth of bacteria that cause UTIs.

4. Blueberries may thwart cancer. Phytochemicals in blueberries decrease the risk of several cancers by protecting cells from chronic inflammation, according to the American Institute for Cancer Research. In addition, the fiber in blueberries helps protect the intestinal lining from colorectal cancer.

5. Blueberries help build stronger bones. Blueberries are rich in phosphorus, zinc, magnesium, calcium, iron, and vitamin K. These nutrients, together with strength-training exercise, can contribute to bone health.

6. Blueberries lower bad cholesterol. The fiber in blueberries may help dissolve LDL cholesterol, also known as "bad" cholesterol, in the bloodstream. A study in the Journal of the Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics determined daily consumption of blueberries helped to improve blood pressure and arterial stiffness in postmenopausal women.

7. Blueberries improve immune function. The blue in blueberries comes from anthocyanin, an antioxidant that increases immune function. The Mayo Clinic also says research indicates compounds in blueberries may delay the effects of vascular dementia or Alzheimer's disease.

8. Blueberries may be an anti-aging treatment. Oxidative DNA damage occurs in every cell in the body each day, according to Healthline. DNA damage is one reason why people grow older. High antioxidants in blueberries can neutralize some free radicals that are implicated in DNA damage.



Tips for safer winter generator usage

Winter will be here soon, and if your electricity goes out due to snow and ice, a generator can keep power flowing to your home or business. The Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI), an international trade association representing manufacturers and suppliers of outdoor power equipment, small engines, battery power systems, portable generators, utility and personal transport vehicles, and golf cars, reminds home and business owners to keep safety in mind when using generators this winter.

"Not having power when you need it is frustrating, so a generator can provide emergency backup power at a reasonable cost," says Kris Kiser, President and CEO of OPEI. "It's important to follow all manufacturer's instructions, and never place a generator in your garage or inside your home or building. It should be a safe distance from the structure and not near an air intake."

More tips include:

• Take stock of your generator. Make sure equipment is in good working order before starting and using it. Do this before a storm hits.

• Review the directions. Follow all manufacturer's instructions. Review the owner's manuals (look manuals up online if you cannot find them) so equipment is operated safely.

• Install a battery operated carbon monoxide detector in your home. This alarm will sound if dangerous levels of carbon monoxide enter the building.

• Have the right fuel on hand. Use the type of fuel recommended by the generator manufacturer to protect this important investment. It is illegal to use any fuel with more than 10% ethanol in outdoor power equipment. (For more information on proper fueling for outdoor power equipment visit www.LookBeforeYouPump.com). It's best to use fresh fuel, but if you are using fuel that has been sitting in a gas can for more than thirty days, add fuel stabilizer to it. Store gas only in an approved container and away from heat sources.

• Ensure portable generators have plenty of ventilation. Generators should NEVER be used in an enclosed area or placed inside a home, a building, or a gacontinued on page 13

Check your smoke detector at least once every six months, if not more frequently. It might not be working. Although the average life of a smoke detector can span as long as 10 to 15 years, the devices can go on the blink, and you wouldn't know it. About 30 percent of smoke detectors fail after 10 years, according to a recent report. And about 50 percent of them shut down after 15 years. • Only add fuel to a cool generator. Before refueling, turn the generator off and let it cool down.

• Charge & use batterypowered generators/inverters properly. Recharge only with the charger specified by the manufacturer. A charger that is suitable for one type of battery pack may not be compatible with another battery pack. Follow all charging instructions and do not charge the battery pack or equipment outside the temperature range specified in the instructions. Charging improperly or at temperatures outside the specified range may damage the battery.

• Plug in safely. If you don't yet have a transfer switch, you can use the outlets on the generator. It's best to plug in appliances directly to the generator. If you must use an extension cord, it should be heavy-duty and designed for outdoor use. It should be rated (in watts or amps) at least equal to the sum of the connected appliance loads. Make sure the cord is free of cuts, and the plug has all three prongs.

• Install a transfer switch. A transfer switch connects the generator to the circuit panel and lets you power hardwired appliances. Most transfer switches also help avoid overload by displaying wattage usage levels.

• Do not use the generator to "backfeed" power into your home electrical system. Trying to power your home's electrical wiring by "backfeeding" - where you plug the generator into a wall outlet – is dangerous. You could hurt utility workers and neighbors served by the same transformer. Backfeeding bypasses built-in circuit protection devices, so you could damage your electronics or start an electrical fire.

Although you may have emailed your resume to the company, bring paper copies for you and your interviewer to refer to. It's also a good idea to have paper copies of your references list in the event that you are asked for them. These should always be on a separate sheet of paper, not on your resume.

Follow up the interview with a handwritten thank you letter. This shows your strong interest in the company, your sincerity, and your attention to detail. Only 1 in 20 jobseekers bother to send a thank you letter, so doing so could be the only difference between you and other good candidates.

If you are unsure of the dress code at the company where you are interviewing, reach out to the recruiter and ask. Once you have a general idea, be sure to choose something that will make you feel confident.

Plan to arrive for your interview 10-15 minutes before the appointed time. Arriving too early can confuse the employer and create an awkward situation. On the other hand, arriving late creates a bad first impression and may doom your chances right off the bat.

Ask for directions when making arrangements for the interview. If you run into a snag, phone ahead at the first sign of trouble. It shows good manners and a respect for the recruiter's time and will give them an opportunity to reschedule if need be.

PA residents warned of a new scam

Pennsylvania Treasurer Stacy Garrity is warning residents of a new scam involving false promises of a state grant and fraudulent requests to pay taxes using gift cards.

In this scam, unsuspecting residents receive a call, an email and/or a letter claiming to be from the Pennsylvania Treasury Department or the Federal Reserve Bank, fraudulently indicating the recipient will be awarded grant money but first must pay taxes. In at least one case, the recipient was told to make the supposed tax payments with gift cards.

Treasury does not

announce grant awards, and it does not collect taxes. In addition, Treasury will never request a payment be made with a gift card, and neither will any other legitimate government agency.

In one case, an elderly Indiana County resident was initially contacted by telephone and told he would receive a \$25,500 grant from the state but had to pay thousands of dollars in taxes first, using gift cards. He purchased the cards, called the scammer back and provided the information needed to access the gift cards. This happened multiple times. Treasury has provided information about this scam to the appropriate law enforcement agencies.

Anyone who believes they have been the victim of a scam or attempted scam should immediately report it to the Federal Trade Commission, the Pennsylvania Office of Attorney General and their local law enforcement agency.

Dog owners reminded to license pets for 2024

All dogs three months of age and older are required to be licensed by Jan. 1 of each year. Dog owners may choose to purchase single-year licenses or a lifetime license, if their dog has some form of permanent identification, such as a microchip or tattoo. Single-year licenses cost \$6.70 for altered animals and \$8.70 for unaltered animals. Lifetime licenses cost \$31.70 for altered animals and \$51.70 for an unaltered animal. Please note that license fees will be increasing effective Feb. 1.

Licenses are available for purchase through county treasurers. A list of treasurers and their contact information is available at www.agriculture.pa.gov.


