

Lebanon Hosts Statewide Fire Chiefs - Statewide fire chiefs convened in Lebanon for a three-day conference to learn, discuss legislation and network at city sites. Lebanon City Fire Department's latest apparatus, BEST, was the star of the event. Lebanon was the first fire company in Pennsylvania to buy Battery Extinguish System Technology (BEST) which is used to fight electric vehicle fires.

Boeing Delivers Last Jumbo Jet - The Boeing Company bid farewell to its iconic 747 jumbo jet. The final plane is the 1,574th built by Boeing and was delivered to Atlas Air. For the future Boeing and rival manufacturers of jets are producing more profitable and fuel efficient wide-body planes.

Furry Forecaster - Punxsutawney Phil emerged from his burrow and saw his shadow. He predicts there will be 6 more weeks of winter.

Civil War Artillery Shell Found at Gettysburg - An unexploded Civil War artillery shell was found at Gettysburg National Military Park. The ordinance was found on the battlefield near Little Round Top and dates back to the Battle of Gettysburg

July 1-3, 1863. The 55th Ordinance Disposal Company team from Fort Belvoir, Virginia safely removed the shell and destroyed it.

Thousands of Migrating Geese Return to Middle Creek - The annual migration of snow geese, tundra swans and Canadian geese begins. The 6,254-acre Pennsylvania Game Commission property has a 400-acre lake and hosts numbers of geese estimated at higher than 100,000 birds.

American Red Cross Volunteers Retire - Paul and Mary Ann LeVan served the Lebanon Valley for nearly six decades as volunteers of the American Red Cross. Together the couple has 108 years of volunteer service to the local community. The LeVans were recognized with a retirement party and a special commendation from Lebanon Mayor Sherry Capello.

Cedar Crest Grad Nominated for Grammy Award in Album Packaging - 1997 Cedar Crest High School graduate Will Stichter was nominated as art director for Best Recording Packaging for "Divers" the album he and longtime friend Matt Stone, a Mount Gretna native, released last year by their ambient/ experimental band Soporus.

Lebanon Area Native to Release First Album - Olivia Farabaugh, a 2013 graduate of Palmyra Area High School, singer and song writer, releases her first full-length CD in Nashville, Tennessee. Olivia was a regular performer on stage at the Lebanon Area Fair, competed on "The Voice" and at the Pentagon. Her big goal is to perform someday at the Grand Ole Opry.

Hollywood Sex Symbol Dies - Raquel Welch, 82, died after a brief illness. Raquel Welch emerged from the sea in a skimpy, furry bikini in the film "One Million Years B.C." and was propelled to international sex-symbol status throughout the 1960'3 and 70's. In addition to acting Welch was a singer and dancer. She won a Golden Glob for her part in "The Three Musketeers" and a nomination for the TV movie "Right to Die".

Lebanon Valley Rail Trail - The Lebanon Valley Rail Trail broke ground on Phases 6A and 6B, a new section of the trail that, when finished, will feature approximately two miles of mixed-use trail and a new city park. The John E. Wengert Memorial Park will be located on Chestnut Street.

MARCH 2023

Hershey Plant-Based Candies Debut - The Hershey Co. announced that Reese's Plant-based Peanut Butter Cups will be its first vegan chocolates sold nationally. A second offering will be Hershey's Plant Based Extra Creamy with Almonds and Sea Salt. Both chocolates are made with oats instead of milk.

Lebanon County 4-H Member Earns Top State Achievement - Jolene Bomgardner, a native of North Lebanon Township and a Lebanon County 4-H Friends Club member, received the Diamond Clover Award, the highest achievement possible in the Pennsylvania 4-H program. The Clover Award Program prompts 4-H members to pursue projects that help them acquire seven fundamental leadership skills: communicating, decision making and problem solving, getting along with others, learning to learn, managing, understanding self, and working in groups. Being recognized with the honor is typically a multi-year process and requires planning and implementing a service-learning project in the community.

Local Pastry Chef Receives Award - Lebanon County Career & Technology Center pastry chef instructor Brian Peffley was named the 2023 Pennsylvania ProStart Educator of the Year. The award is presented annually to recognize culinary arts educators who demonstrate excellence in the classroom, along with passion, commitment and creativity in all aspects of the ProStart program. This program is offered by the National Restaurant Association Educational Foundation.

Deraco's Closes - Longtime Lebanon eatery, Gus Deraco's closes its doors for the last time. Deraco's, located on Cumberland Street opened right around the middle of the 20th century and was known for its "hoagie Wagon" and cheesesteaks.

Bethel-Tulpehocken Library Ground Breaking Ceremony - Ground breaking began for the libraries' 2.3 million dollar expansion and renovation project. This project will enlarge the library from 1,500 square feet to 8,000 square feet and has been in the works for the last 10 years. It is expected to be completed by January of 2024.


Local Sophomore Heads to National Speaking Competition - Amelia Summers, a sophomore at Annville Cleona High School represented Pennsylvania in the 2023 American Legion Oratorical Contest. Her 10 minute speech was on the United States Constitution and how it empowers young people through voting, protests and protects them against authoritarianism.

APRIL 2023

Lebanon VA Recognized Along With PSU Teacher - Lebanon VA Medical Center hospitals' Dr. Benny Bhaskar was awarded the 2022 Medicine Clerkship Teacher of the Year Award for Affiliate Faculty in the Medicine Category from the Penn State University College of Medicine.

Lebanon County Libraries Launch New App - The Lebanon County Libraries launched a new app which makes library services available on patrons' Android or iOS mobile devices. Features include scanning ISBN barcodes to quickly look up availability of books, accessing account information, storing your library digitally and browsing the eLibrary.

Biden Ends Covid-19 Pandemic National Emergency - The U.S. national emergency to respond to the Covid-19 pandemic ends as President Joe Biden





signed a bipartisan congressional resolution to bring it to a close after 3 years. It is time to return to normal procedures.

Lebanon County Prison Chaplain Recognized For 30 Years of Service - The Rev. Marilyn Nolte, Jubilee Ministries Chaplain at Lebanon County Correctional Facility was recognized by the county commissioners for her 30 years of service to the prison.

Norleb Votes to Officially Close Four Schools - The Northern Lebanon School District Board of Directors voted to close East Hanover Elementary, Fredricksburg Elementary, Jonestown Elementary and Lickdale Elementary Schools at the finish of 2022-2023 school year. All teachers and students will be moved to the new Northern Lebanon Elementary School. The old school buildings will be sold.

Lebanon County 4-H Leader Honored for Serving 50 Years - Richard (Dick) Kreider was presented with a mahogany park bench in honor of his 50 years as a volunteer leader of the Lebanon County 4-H Livestock Club.

Iconic Wertz Candies Sold - Wertz Candies, a Lebanon tradition for nearly a century has new owners. The Wertz name has been synonymous with handmade opera fudge, caramel corn, jelly filled chocolates and other goodies for 90 some years. In a surprising twist of fate, the new owners, Lindsay and Rob have the same last name, Wertz. There are no known genealogical ties between the families that have been identified, but they do share a love of the store's history and sweets.

MAY 2023

Britain's King Charles III Crowned - King Charles III was crowned at Westminister Abbey, in a coronation ceremony steeped in ancient ritual and brimming with bling. It was a display of heritage, tradition and spectacle unmatched around the world. King Charles III is the 40th sovereign to be enthroned in the Abbey and at 74, the oldest.

Ceder Crest Team Wins "Quiz Bowl" - The Ceder Crest High School Quiz Bowl team won its first statewide Pennsylvania State Academic Championship. The team is now preparing to compete against the top teams in the country at the National Academic Quiz Tournaments in Atlanta later this year.

FirstEnergy Completes \$9 Million Upgrade - FirstEnergy Corp's subsidiary, Mid Atlantic Interstate Transmission completed a \$9 million project to rebuild a high voltage powerline and portions of the Lebanon Valley Rail Trail. 127 New poles, new wires, upgraded equipment at power stations and repaved parts of the trail are all part of the project. The project will enhance the electrical system for around 3,300 Met-Ed customers in Lebanon County.

Jonestown Bank Celebrates 150 Years - The Jonestown Bank & Trust celebrated its 150 years in service with a Community Fun Day. The free event was held at the Union Canal Tunnel Park in Lebanon. It featured a petting zoo, bounce house and slide, face painting, balloon artists, carnival games and scavenger hunts. Food trucks were on site and there were celebrity "dunk" tanks and live entertainment.

Lebanon Valley Conservancy Awards Light Scholarship - The 2023 Richard H. and Karen R. Light Memorial Scholarship was awarded to Lebanon Valley College sophomore Hannah Horengic. The \$2,500 scholarship is awarded annually to an outstanding local student who plans to pursue a career in the environmental sciences.

Cedar Crest Senior Wins Harmonia Music Scholarship - Cedar Crest High School graduating senior Sophia Medzoyan was awarded a \$2,000 scholarship from the Harmonia Music Association. The scholarship selection required applicants to be seniors from a Lebanon County school, accepted by a college or university and audition on one instrument, including voice.

Iconic Rock Star Tina Turner Dies - Tina Turner, 83, the unstoppable singer and stage performer passed away after a long illness in her home in Kusnacht, Switzerland. Her trademarks were her growling contralto, her bold smile and strong cheekbones, her palette of wigs and the muscular, quickstepping, long legs. She sold more than 150 million records

worldwide, won 12 Grammys and was voted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1991.

Annville Free Library's Annual "Book It" Fun Run - The Annville Free Library held its 7th annual Book It 5k Fun Run fundraiser at the Annville-Cleona High School.

Rotary Club of Palmyra Holds Dedication - The Rotary Club of Palmyra held a dedication of "Flags for Heros" at the Palmyra Area School District offices. A sea of these flags flank the school, each one represents a local hero.

JUNE 2023

34th Annual Historic Old Annville Day - The Friends of Old Annville held their 34th annual Historic Old Annville Day with an anticipated 6 to 8,000 people attending. There was live music, 200 vendors, food trucks including ice cream, popcorn, funnel cakes, burgers, fries and more. West Main street was closed for the event.

Scott Buchle Recognized by Lebanon County Ambulance Association - Scott Buchle was recognized with a Lifetime Achievement Award for EMS service from the Lebanon County Ambulance Association. Buchle currently serves as

director for Penn State Health Life Lion.

Mayor Names City Fire Chief - Lebanon mayor Sherry Capello named acting city fire chief Aaron "AJ" Sweitzer to take the City Fire Chief job permanently. Mayor Capello feels Sweitzer's first-hand knowledge of department administration, his communication skills and on-the-job experience and credentials will provide him every opportunity for success.

"Litter Ladies"Honored - LuAnn Horn and Kathy Redinger were honored by Shannon Reiter, president of Keep America Beautiful with the Keep American Beautiful's Community Pride Award in recognition of their volunteer litter control efforts.

Commissioners Thank Carol Davies for Her Service - Carol Davies, administrator of the Lebanon County Area Agency on Aging was thanked for "outstanding service" during her more than three decades of service and wished her a rewarding retirement.

Worlds Largest Bologna Sandwich - This year the worlds largest Lebanon bologna sandwich (150 feet long) was built at the Lebanon Area Fair. Fairgoers were able to get a free slice, while it lasted, during the Community Night celebration.

Godshall's Quality Meats Bags Guinness Record - Lebanon's Godshall's Quality Meats, located in North Lebanon Township, won the official Guinness World Record title for the longest piece of turkey bacon. The record-breaking slice measured 17 feet 3/4 inches long and 23 inches wide, more than 1,000 times the size of a regular slice of turkey bacon.

Reifsnyder Wins Second Straight Amateur Golf Championship - Blake Reifsnyder, 26 won the Lebanon County Amateur Golf Championship at the Blue Mountain Golf Course. It was his second straight win of the county amateur championship. Derrick Brennan was runner-up, Greg Seidel and John DiGiacomo tied for third.

North Lebanon Township Manager Retires - North Lebanon Township manager Cheri Grumbine retired after 37 years as a municipal employee. The assistant township manager Lori Brooks will step up and take the position as well as township secretary and assistant township treasurer. Molly Lum will be the new assistant township manager.

JULY 2023

Price of U.S. Postal Stamps Rises - The price of forever stamps will rise from .63 cents to .66 cents, it is the second rise this year. Additional increases include postcards (.51 cents), and International postcards and one-ounce letters (\$1.50).

"Baked with a Twist" Opens - A new, family owned, soft pretzel stand opened this month in the Lebanon Farmers Market. Run by the Hoppe family "Baked with a Twist" sells drinks, home-made baked goods and soft pretzels.

Habitat for Humanity Dedicates Home - The Lancaster-Lebanon Habitat for Humanity dedicated the home located at 1824 Chestnut Street. This program provides first-time home buyers with a mortgage that has zero percent interest and is no more than 30 percent of their income.

Chocolate Tour Honors Cyclists - The 13th annual Donegal Insurance Chocoate Tour launched from the Manheim Farm Show featuring a varity of rides from 10 to 100 miles. The funds raised by these rides provide money for cancer research and other grants. The rides were dedicated to cyclists who passed away from cancer in the past year. They were Jim Wilson, Rich Snively and Bernhard Robertson.

Fine Art Show Returns to Lititz - The 56th annual Lititz Outdoor Art Show was held in the Lititz Springs Park. More than 130 artists displayed their work.

AUGUST 2023

Betty Young Celebrates 100 Years - Betty Young, lifelong resident of Lebanon County, celebrated her 100th birthday. Betty, mother of 9 children, 30 grand children, 54 great-grand children and 16 great-great-grand children was honored with a special gathering at Friedends Church, Myerstown.

New Elementary School is Ready - The new Northern Lebanon Elementary School is ready for the new school year and the teachers began setting up their classrooms. The new building will hold kindergarten through sixth grade from what was previously four seperate schools. Total combined student count is roughly 1,050 students.

LCCM Opens Market on 7th - Lebanon County Christian Ministries opened a new supplemental food pantry on 7th street. The new pantry is a "choice" pantry concept. Qualifing people can choose the food items they will actually use, instead of getting a pre-packaged box of items they might not eat, saving food waste.

The Generosity of Ester M. Martin Benifits Three Local Non-profits -The Lebanon County Agriculture Preservation Board, Lebanon County 4-H and the Humane Society of Lebanon County are all three equal beneficiaries from the 1.52 million dollar estate of Ester M. Martin. Through her grace and generosity the future preservation of Lebanon County farmlands will be greatly affected. She created a legacy for her family that will live in perpetuity.

Light Goes Out - Regulations went into effect that effectively ban incandescent light bulbs. LED bulbs use 90% less energy and last 25 times longer than the incandescent bulbs, saving billions of dollars in



energy costs.

According to the American Red Cross, after a person has donated blood, his or her red cells need about four to six weeks before they are completely replaced. That is why organizations like the Red Cross require donors wait at least eight weeks between donations. That is not to be confused with apheresis, a process by which platelets and other blood components, such as red cells and plasma, are collected from a donor. During apheresis, a cell separator is used to collect platelets or other components from blood that is drawn from the donor. The remaining components are then returned to the donor during the donation process. As many as 24 apheresis donations can be made in a single year, though the apheresis donation process, which can last as long as two hours, takes longer than a typical blood donation.




